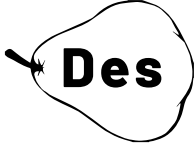
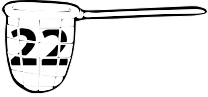
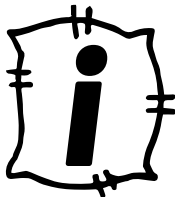
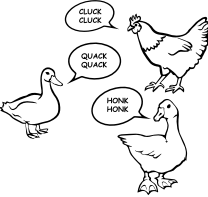
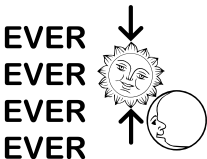
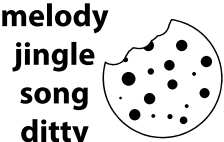
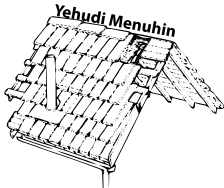
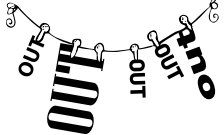


Picture Words 2

According to the OED, a Rebus is a puzzle in which words are shown by using combinations of pictures and letters; for instance, apex might be represented by a picture of an ape followed by a letter X.
