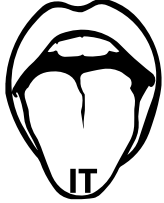
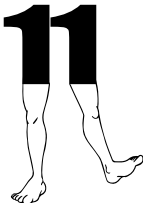
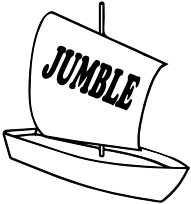
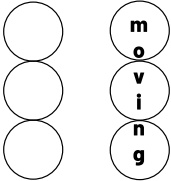
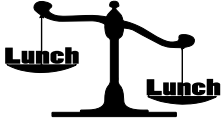
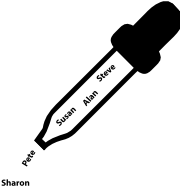
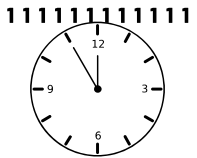


Picture Words 4

According to the OED, a Rebus is a puzzle in which words are represented by combinations of pictures and letters; for instance, apex might be represented by a picture of an ape followed by the letter X.
