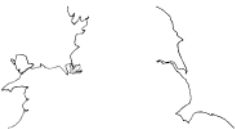
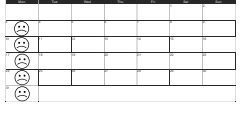
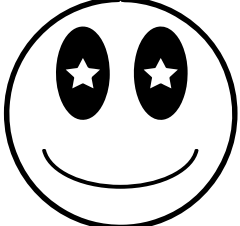
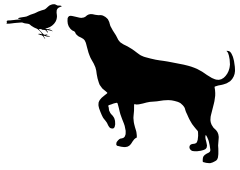
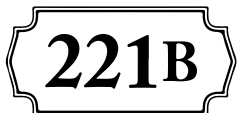
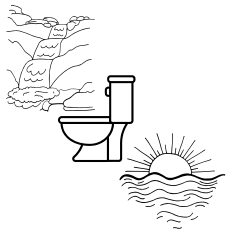
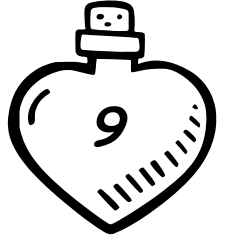
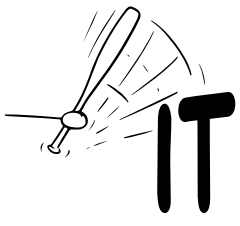


Song Pictograms 06
