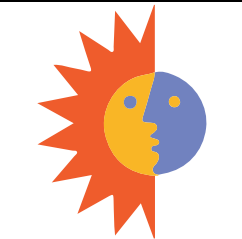
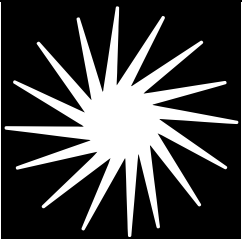


ITV Regional Idents

Channel (Islands) TV (owned by ITV plc since 2012)	Scottish Television 1957	Granada Television (in 2004 it with Carlton Communications to form ITV plc)	Border TV (Border Television was taken over by Granada plc in 2001)
			
Anglia Television (now owned and operated by ITV plc)	Television South (1 January 1982 at 9.25 am and 31 December 1992)	Westward Television (from 29 April 1961 until 31 December 1981)	Yorkshire TV (now owned and operated by ITV plc under the licence name of ITV Broadcasting Limited (along with all the other ITV plc-owned franchises))
			
Southern Television (from 30 August 1958 to 31 December 1981)	Meridian (replaced Television South in 1993)	Rediffusion London Television (London on weekdays between 22 September 1955 and 29 July 1968)	Associated TeleVision (In 1982, ATV was restructured and rebranded as Central Independent Television)

			
TV-am (from 1 February 1983 until 31 December 1992)	Ulster TV (now branded on air as ITV1)	Tyne Tees TV (Tyne Tees became part of ITV plc in 2004)	ABC TV (provided the weekend service in the Midlands and Northern England regions)
