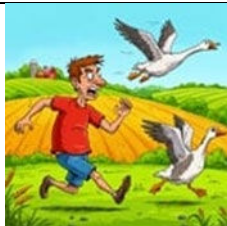
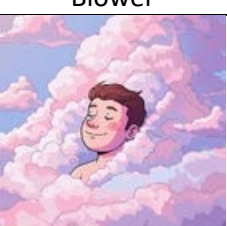
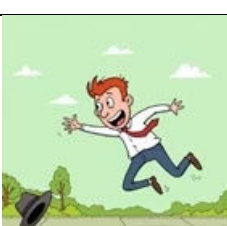
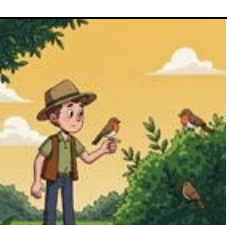
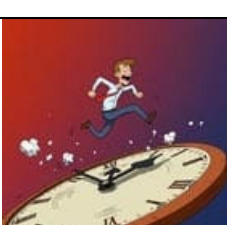


Idioms 04
