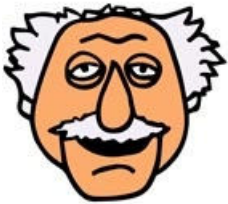


Sesame Street and The Muppet Show

Sesame Street and The Muppet Show are related but distinct entities. While both feature Muppets created by Jim Henson, they are separate franchises with different owners. "Sesame Street" focuses on educational content for preschoolers and is owned by Sesame Workshop. "The Muppet Show" is a comedy variety show aimed at a broader audience and is now owned by Disney. Some Muppets originated on "Sesame Street" and later appeared on "The Muppet Show," but their universes are not considered the same.
