

Memorable Quotations 01

Many celebrities, politicians, and people otherwise in the public eye, have made comment on something or someone or said anything else that is repeated and remembered. Such utterances are repeated by others as quotations. The process by which an utterance becomes a lasting quotation is not accidental; it is a convergence of intrinsic qualities of the phrase itself and extrinsic factors related to the speaker and the moment in which the words were spoken. Whether the quote was spoken by the person it's attributed to, is hard to prove in some cases, it is however generally accepted they did. There are some famous misattributions, such as those related to Marie Antoinette, who didn't say "let them eat cake", in response to peasants having no bread. It was not attributed to her until 50 years after her death. The actual French phrase was "Qu'ils mangent de la brioche," which translates to "Let them eat brioche".
