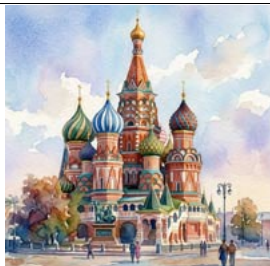
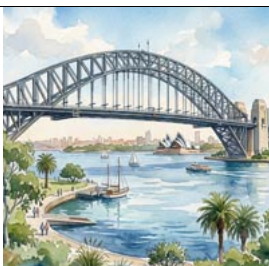


Manmade World Landmarks
